## Paramodernities

Paramodernities is a series of lecture-performances, or dance-experiments, generated through deconstructions of landmark modern choreographies, performed alongside contributions by scholars and writers who situate these iconic works and artists within the larger project of Modernism. Exploring foundational tenets of modern discourse -such as sovereignty, race, feminism, and nihilism, Paramodernities includes public discussions as inseparable parts of each installment.

Paramodernities excavates the canon of modern dance in radical, reverent, and violent ways. It does so to spark new choreographies, ideas, and conversations.


The project is a modular collection of six pieces, each created as an independent unit, devoted to one historical dance, with a distinct creative process, and involving a different constellation of dancers and a scholar. Each piece allows for a web of discourse, reflection, and a re-imagining of iconic vocabulary to unfold. The installments range from 25-45 minutes and can be performed in nearly any combination.

Paramodernities can be presented in de-theatricalized environments. It offers a unique hybrid of academic conference, dance performance, and town hall gathering. It has the potential to take the work out of the contemporary experimental scene and into different contexts, from libraries to classrooms to public spaces.








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
